



Walk Description

Title: Turvey (East End) - Stevington - Circular

Map: OS Explorer 208

Distance: 8 Miles

Ascent: 448ft

Start: Layby – A428 - Turvey (East End) – MapRef SP 95899 52189

- 1) Facing towards the **A428** road turn LEFT and walk on the pavement to a waymarked footpath on the LEFT – Walk for 200 metres and look for a footpath on the LEFT – Walk through a small field to the right hand corner into the next field – Head in a 1 o'clock direction to an access road – Turn LEFT on to the access road and where it bends left turn RIGHT on to a footpath – Walk with a small field on the right and then with a hedge on your right walk on the edge of a large field until a T junction with some woods (**Pictshill Gorse**) in front of you- Turn LEFT and walk to the end of the woods on your right – Turn RIGHT and follow the edge of the woods on your right - At the end of the woods cross into the next field and walk to a small copse in front of you – Skirt to the left of the copse and enter the next field – Head across in a 1 o'clock direction to a gap in the hedge opposite – Cross into the next field and follow the line of a hedge on the right - At the end of the field go through a small copse to a road – Turn LEFT and walk to the **A428** road. (1¾ Miles)
- 2) Cross the **A428** road with care – Turn RIGHT and walk on the grass verge to a road on the LEFT – Walk on the road for ½ mile to a waymarked bridleway on the LEFT – Cross the field and on reaching the end of a hedge bear right and walk with the hedge on the left – At the end of the hedge cross through the gap in front of you into a scrubby field – Walk with the hedge on your left – This turns into a fence – Follow the path past some buildings on the left on to a track – Turn RIGHT and walk to a bridge over an old railway track into some woods – Take the forest ride in a 2 o'clock direction and walk through the woods – At the end of the woods go through a gap in the hedge into a large arable field – Head straight across the field towards some trees – Skirt to the right of the trees and follow the path with the woods on your left – The path goes between two hedges and past a farm on the right – Walk on to a road - Turn LEFT and walk for ½ mile into **Stevington**. (4¼ Miles)
- 3) At the cross roads turn LEFT and follow the road for 200 metres – Look for where a water course on the left turns left away from the road and take an unmarked footpath LEFT – Stay to the right of the water course and with a hedge on the right and walk to a farm building on the left – Turn RIGHT into a arable field and walk on the edge with a hedge on your left – Cross into another field and walk to a T junction – Turn RIGHT and walk to a road – Turn LEFT and follow the road for ¼ mile to a waymarked bridleway on the LEFT – Keep to the hedge on your right and walk through three fields to a T junction – Go through the gap in the hedge and turn RIGHT – Follow the bridleway towards **Great Oaks Wood**. (5¾ Miles)

- 4) On reaching the corner of the woods bear LEFT and follow the track to the woods again on the right – Continue to follow the track with the woods on your right – The track bends right then left and soon leaves the wood on the right – Continue to follow the track to a hedge on the right – On reaching a hedge in front of you go through the gate and turn LEFT – Follow the path with a hedge on your left – At the end of the hedge continue on in the same direction across the field to a gap in the hedge – Go through and walk to a track - Turn RIGHT and follow the track past **Great Oaks Farm** on to the farms access road – Walk past some ponds on the right and stay on the access road which bends left and drops down to the **A428** road – Cross the road on to the pavement and turn LEFT back to the start.

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
